Years back now Terry and I were given the title of Healing Hearts through Love and Un-


derstanding by our friends. I had to learn myself first before I could be there for others.



Our gardeners have done their part. The Co-op has raised over \$3,200 toward the \$5,000 plus that we need to purchase a proper refrigerated display case. The new crop will begin showing up in the store in April.

Any help you can give us in raising another \$2,000 would be greatly appreciated by the entire community.
